

The Wildlife Centre of Wales - Canolfan Byd Natur Cymru

Stunning scenery, rare and beautiful wildlife

The boulder strewn River Wye tumbles and cuts its way through the Cambrian Mountains in the heart of Wales.

18 miles south from its source where the valley narrows and then meets the waters of the River Elan, lies the small market town of Rhayader, nestling amid beautiful rugged scenery.

To the west of the town the mountain top plateaux is draped in a mosaic of heather and grass moorland.

Gnarled woodlands of oak hang on the valley sides and high rocky outcrops and cliffs overlook small patchwork farms.

Elan Estate, Welsh Water/Elan Valley Trust: 70 square miles of stunning landscape with rivers, streams and reservoirs, traditional upland farms, flower rich hay meadows and oak woodland. Designated a special conservation area for its rich and precious wildlife. (See advert page 10)

Carngafallt RSPB Nature Reserve: 1000 acres of internationally important ancient oak woodland, valley side fridd and moorland of heather and bilberry with whinchats, stonechats, skylarks, meadow pipits and cuckoos.

RHAYADER

Coed Dolifor Woodland Trust Nature Reserve: 30 acres of mixed woodland with pied flycatchers, redstarts and wood warblers in spring. Access by public and permissive paths. Tel 0800 026 9650 www.woodlandtrust.org.uk

Abergwesyn Commons, National Trust: 16,500 acres of upland "wilderness" with peat bog areas of sphagnum moss, cotton grass, wild cranberry, bog asphodel and sundew, where red grouse, curlew and golden plover still call.
